

Nambawan Super Limited (NSL) is progressing on its site at 9 mile and increasing communication with squatters of the site to prepare them for relocation.

1. Nambawan Super project team now in permanent camp on site

In August, the NSL Project Manager commenced construction of a permanent camp on the site to enable squatters access to accurate, up-to-date information from recognised NSL representatives.

Construction is expected to be completed by 27 September and squatters will be able to visit the site office to received accurate information from trusted and recognised representatives of the Fund.

2. Nambawan Super is not taking payments or selling land to squatters

It has come to the attention of NSL that opportunists may be falsely representing themselves as NSL representatives and taking payments, stating they can secure land for squatters.

No Nambawan Super representatives have permission to sell or take any payments relating to the 9 mile site. To enable the orderly redevelopment of the site and delivery of services and infrastructure NSL is working to secure vacant possession of the site.

All squatters are required to relocate.

It would be a travesty if squatters who have already been defrauded by fake customary land owners, are then defrauded a second time.

Squatters are advised to check any claims with the recognised NSL representatives who are located on site.

3. Neighbours of the site to receive notices to remove encroachments

From the week commencing 13 September, Nambawan Super's project team will be issuing notices to occupants living on the boundary giving 4 week's notice to remove any belongings that are encroaching on NSL land. The site boundary is clearly pegged in preparation for fencing. In 4 weeks fencing preparations will be begin.

4. Memorandum of understanding with NCDC

NSL has continued discussions with NCDC on matter of relocation, however no agreement has been finalised.

If no agreement is reached by end September 2021, NSL will enforce its legal rights and commence a vacant possession of the site.

Squatters will be given formal notice of relocation and advised of how the relocation process will be managed.
